Class Ratings:

4 - intermediate climbing, constant use of hands, high exposure, most do use rope/some do not

5 - technical rock climbing - using rope, harness, climbing shoes, anchors, and protection hardware (5.0 through 5.14 - 5.0 easy, 5.14 most difficult)
